Who may apply:

City or township, county, special district, state, and federally recognized Native American tribal governments; independent school districts; public and state-controlled institutions of higher education; law enforcement and correctional agencies; and other entities such as State Administering Agencies (SAAs) and other units of local government.

Why Apply:

Receive funding to purchase or lease body-worn cameras (BWCs) to establish, expand, or enhance a comprehensive BWC program; create a demonstration project to improve the management, sharing, and integration of digital evidence generated from BWCs; optimize how prosecutors leverage BWC footage to improve operations; or use BWC footage to enhance officer training or constitutional policing practices.

Maximum per award:

- Up to \$2 million per award for law enforcement and correctional agencies.
- Up to \$1 million per demonstration project award.

BJA encourages the following entities to apply:

- Agencies that have not previously received BJA funding.
- Convening or governing bodies (e.g., SAAs) that can apply on behalf of one or more entities.

Examples of strategies/ activities that can be funded:

- Establish, expand, or enhance a comprehensive BWC program.
- Integrate digital data footage from BWCs with other forms of digital evidence.
- Improve prosecutors' capacity to receive, access, process, and use digital evidence from BWCs.

How to apply and when:

Submit a two-step application.

- 1. Register in <u>Grants.gov</u> and follow the prompts to submit the SF-424 form by October 27, 2025.
- 2. Then complete the full application in <u>JustGrants.usdoj.gov</u> by November 3, 2025. The application's major elements are:
 - a. The **proposal abstract** that summarizes the problem you wish to address with your project (no more than 400 words).
 - b. The **proposal narrative** that describes your project's strategies, activities, and major deliverables as well as your capacity to address the problem.
 - c. The **web-based budget** form that details how you will allocate the grant funds by task, date, and responsible person.
