Who may apply:

City or township, county, special district, federally recognized Native American tribal, or Native American tribal organizations, other than federally recognized tribal governments.

Why Apply:

Receive funding to reduce violent crime and improve public trust through a range of cross-sector enforcement, prevention, and intervention strategies that leverage active collaboration with communities through sustained partnerships and engagement. Intervention and prevention strategies support and enhance enforcement activities through targeted engagement, deterrence-based approaches, and structured support and service systems with a focus on intervening with individuals at the highest risk of involvement in violent crime—either as perpetrators or victims.

Maximum per award:

Up to \$2,000,000

BJA encourages the following entities to apply:

- · Agencies that have not previously received BJA funding.
- Native American tribal governments.

Examples of strategies/ activities that can be funded:

- Develop, implement, expand, and/or enhance comprehensive CVI strategies to maximize existing and new resources.
- Conduct needs and gap assessments.
- Build a new, or strengthen an existing, multidisciplinary working group to serve as the CVIPI team.
- Develop and implement a data-driven Violence Reduction Strategic Plan.
- Enhance capacity to lead proactive CVI strategies.
- Deliver training, technical assistance, and subawards to subrecipient CBOs to implement and lead CVI strategies.

How to apply and when:

Submit a two-step application.

- 1. Register in <u>Grants.gov</u> and follow the prompts to submit the SF-424 form by October 27, 2025.
- 2. Then complete the full application in <u>JustGrants.usdoj.gov</u> by November 3, 2025. The application's major elements are:
 - a. The **proposal abstract** that summarizes the problem you wish to address with your project (no more than 400 words).
 - b. The **proposal narrative** that describes your project's strategies, activities, and major deliverables as well as your capacity to address the problem.
 - c. The **web-based budget** form that details how you will allocate the grant funds by task, date, and responsible person.
