VALOR Initiative Overview

- National training and technical assistance (TTA) initiative
- State, local, tribal, and territorial law enforcement
- Distinct programs addressing officer safety and wellness (OSW) topics & concerns
- Research/Evidence-based
- Innovative, behavior-changing TTA based on adult learning principles





Eligibility

- For profit organizations other than small businesses;
- Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS;
- Institutions of higher education, including private institutions of higher education and public and state controlled institutions of higher education;
- State governments, county governments, city or township governments, and special district governments; and
- Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized).

- Category 2: National Suicide Awareness for Law Enforcement Officers Program (SAFLEO Program)

One award under each category



Category 1: VALOR Officer Safety and Wellness Training and Technical Assistance Program (VALOR Program)

- Continue and further enhance BJA's flagship OSW suite of training, resources, and technical assistance.
- \$6,700,000



- 18, 24, or 36 month performance period starting 10/1/22
- Fast paced program; also provides support to BJA for the entire Initiative, including a VALOR Initiative database ("dashboard")



Category 1: VALOR Program, con't.

- Capacity to provide online/virtual and in-person TTA in multiple locations concurrently
- Deliverables listed on pages 9 and 10 of solicitation
- Possible subawards/microgrants to evaluate VALOR Program impact



Category 2: National Suicide Awareness for Law Enforcement Officers Program (SAFLEO Program)

- Continue and further enhance BJA's law enforcement suicide prevention, education, and awareness work.
- \$2,100,000



- 18, 24, or 36 month performance period starting 10/1/22
- Fast paced program
- Capacity to provide online/virtual and in-person TTA in multiple locations concurrently



Category 2: SAFLEO Program, con't.

- Culturally informed and culturally sensitive TTA addressing the complex nature of policing and factors that can have an effect on officers possibly developing suicidal ideation
- Resources for agencies, officers, family members/friends, and other appropriate stakeholders
- Deliverables listed on pages 11 and 12 of solicitation



Category 3: Law Enforcement Agency and Officer Resilience Training Program (Resilience Program)

- Continue and further enhance BJA's law enforcement resilience skills-building TTA program.
- \$1,800,000
- 18 or 24 month performance period starting 10/1/22
- Capacity to provide online/virtual and in-person TTA; maximize number of agencies and officers trained



Category 3: Resilience Program, con't.

- Skill-based trainings with skills exercises and reinforcement resources
- Capacity to deliver trainings concurrently in multiple locations or with marked frequency
- Deliverables listed on pages 12 and 13 of solicitation



Category 4: National Law Enforcement Roadway Safety Program (NLERS Program)

- Continue and further enhance BJA's law enforcement roadway safety training and resource program.
- \$1,100,000



- 18 or 24 month performance period starting 10/1/22
- TTA on roadway threats and concerns and should include, but not be limited to: traffic stops, emergency vehicle operations, all-weather driving, and directing traffic



Category 4: NLERS Program, con't.

- Capacity to deliver trainings concurrently in multiple locations or with marked frequency
- Deliverables listed on pages 13 and 14 of solicitation



Things to Keep in Mind – Application

- Training Delivery Chart submission with application
- Subject Matter Experts and Key Personnel Resumes with application
- Program timeline for major milestones and deliverables with application
- Proposal of additional deliverables



Additional Things to Keep in Mind

- Closely work with BJA; regularly scheduled voice/video calls
- Creation of an Advisory Board
- Participation in two VALOR Initiative provider meetings
- Coordination/Collaboration with partner VALOR Initiative providers



Additional Things to Keep in Mind, con't.

- Required VALOR Initiative database entries
- Ad hoc tasks/deliverables
- Potential for time-sensitive data calls/requests
- Continuation funding may be provided and is subject to availability of appropriated funds and program performance



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Are the competitive programs under this solicitation meant for entities to apply to receive training and/or technical assistance?

A: No. Applicants under this solicitation must be proposing to develop and deliver training and/or technical assistance to the policing field.

Q: Can my organization apply under more than one category?

A: Yes. Entities may submit applications under more than one category. Each application must specifically address what is being requested under that specific category.



Frequently Asked Questions, con't.

Q: What should be included in my application?

A: Please review the "Application and Submission Information" section of the solicitation, beginning on page 16. Among what is needed: Abstract, Narrative, Budget Worksheet, Budget Narrative, Training Delivery Chart, Timeline, Resumes, etc.

Q: Can my organization propose to partner with other entities?

A: Yes. Partnering with other entities is allowable but only one entity may submit the application and assume fiscal/management responsibilities. We encourage applicants to identify those partner organizations within the application, when possible.

- <u>Step 1</u>: Submit an SF-424 and an SF-LLL at <u>Grants.gov</u>. Deadline May 20, 2022; 8:59 PM
- <u>Step 2</u>: Submit the full application, with attachments, at <u>JusticeGrants.usdoj.gov</u>. Deadline – May 25, 2022; 8:59 PM

*NOTE: Submission deadline times for both Grants.gov and JustGrants are now 8:59pm ET, not 11:59pm ET as in past years.

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
