What is the Office of Justice Programs?

- The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) provides grant funding, training, research, and statistics to the criminal justice community.
- OJP is one of three grantmaking components of the Department of Justice along with the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS).

SECTION 2

BYRNE SCIP PROGRAM OVERVIEW







The Bipartisan Safer **Communities Act** amended the Edward Byrne Memorial **Justice Assistance** Grant (JAG) Statute and created the State Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP)

Implementation of state crisis intervention court proceedings and related programs or initiatives, including, but not limited to: (i) mental health courts, (ii) drug courts, (iii) veterans courts, and (iv) extreme risk protection order (ERPO) programs.

Expanded the general authorization to include "civil proceedings" in addition to criminal justice.

Appropriated \$150 million per year for 5 years (FY22–FY26) specifically for the new state crisis intervention court proceedings and related program initiatives.

Updated from FY23

Crisis intervention "related programs or initiatives"

FAQ #32

Programs/initiatives that have a direct connection to crisis intervention, which is focused on identifying risk and intervening before harm occurs.

Programs/activities exclusively focused on response to crime in progress or already committed would not be considered crisis intervention.

Crisis Intervention Programs



General violence prevention, investigation, or general law enforcement strategies, without the connection to crisis intervention, would not be appropriate under Byrne SCIP

Could be included in other BJA programs, e.g., Byrne JAG program

Program plans and subaward project descriptions submitted to BJA should clearly show how the proposed activities and costs will address crisis intervention.

 While activities might also have broader prevention outcomes or assist with the response to violence already occurring, the primary focus should be targeted crisis intervention.

The primary focus and purpose of proposed activities and costs should be targeted crisis intervention.

Unallowable Costs

FAQ #16

- In addition to the unallowable costs identified in the DOJ Grants Financial Guide, award funds may not be used for the following:
- Prizes, rewards, entertainment, trinkets (or any type of monetary incentive)
- Client stipends
- Gift cards
- Food and beverage
- Unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), including unmanned aircraft vehicles (UAV) and all accompanying accessories to support UAS or UAV
- Expenditures prohibited by EO 14074:

Eligibility

- Only states may apply under Byrne SCIP, and states must designate a single <u>State Administering Agency</u> (SAA) that has authority to apply on their behalf.
- The term "states" includes:
 - District of Columbia
 - Commonwealth of Puerto Rico
 - Northern Mariana Islands
 - o U.S. Virgin Islands
 - o Guam
 - o American Samoa

Grants.gov JustGrants

After submission of the SF-424 and SF-LLL in Grants.gov, the application will migrate to JustGrants for completion of full application.

Proposal Narrative

- A preliminary program plan or
- The final program plan developed in coordination with and demonstrating evidence of approval by the Crisis Intervention Advisory Board (CIAB).

The final program plan must be expressly approved by BJA postaward.





Budget Worksheet and Narrative

Reflects the preliminary, anticipated budget, or the final budget developed in coordination with and demonstrating evidence of approval by the Crisis Intervention Advisory Board (CIAB).

- Include the required direct local pass through and less-than-\$10,000 pass through requirements
- Direct administrative costs cannot exceed 10% of the total award amount.

The final budget must be expressly approved by BJA post-award.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS







Crisis Intervention Advisory Board

Purpose

To inform and guide the state's gun violence reduction programs/initiatives.

Mandatory members

- law enforcement
- o the community
- o courts
- o prosecution
- behavioral health providers
- o victim services
- legal counsel






Program And Budget Plans

- The program and budget plans must be expressly approved by BJA.
- Post-award approval is completed via a Programmatic Scope Change GAM.
- The program and budget plan withholding condition will allow obligations not to exceed \$20,000 for the sole purpose of developing the program and budget plans in coordination with the Crisis Intervention Advisory Board.
- For any GAMs to substantively change the program's scope or budget, Advisory Board approval will be required.

Federal Authorization Of Subawards

All subawards must be expressly authorized by BJA post award via GAM before funds can be obligated for subawards.

ERPO Program Requirements



To use funding to support ERPO programs you must submit a principal legal officer signed Certification Relating to Pub. L. No. 90-351, Title I, Sec. 501(a)(1)(I)(iv) (Extreme-Risk Protection-Order Programs), certifying that the extreme risk protection-order program to be funded satisfies each of the requirements outlined in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act prior to the use of grant funds for ERPO programs.



- As a condition of the award, cooperate with BJA and training and technical assistance providers to ensure that programs are designed to protect the constitutional rights of individuals.
- Cooperate with the statutorily required evaluation activities.
- Use of grant funds for a research partner are encouraged.







Administrative Costs


- Up to 10 percent of the total award may be used for direct administrative costs.
 - Any administrative costs used must come from the state share of the award; it cannot reduce the pass-through amounts.
- There is no statutory limitation on INDIRECT costs.
- Subaward recipients are also limited to 10 percent for direct administrative costs.





Obligations, Expenditures, and Draw Downs

- Funds may not be drawn down in advance, but based upon immediate disbursement/reimbursement needs
- The program and budget plan withholding condition will allow obligations not to exceed \$20,000 for the sole purpose of developing the program and budget plans in coordination with the Crisis Intervention Advisory Board.





Performance Reporting

- Quarterly performance reports must be submitted through BJA's Performance Measurement Tool (PMT) website: https://bjapmt.ojp.gov.
- Semi-annual progress reports must be submitted through JustGrants and must contain the quarterly PMT reports for the applicable semi-annual reporting period.

Pass-through Requirements

Direct Local

This 40 percent portion is comprised of the share of funds, proportionately decreased, that was available for direct local JAG awards in FY 2023

Less-than \$10,000

The share of funds, proportionately decreased, that was added to the state share in FY 2023 for less-than-\$10,000 jurisdictions.

• The direct local pass-through is mandatory and not eligible for a waiver. The less-than-\$10,000 pass-through is eligible for a waiver.



A SAM.gov Entity Validation Update

GSA implemented a new process to validate an entity's legal business name and physical address when requesting a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and for completing a SAM.gov entity registration. Due to a high volume of requests, entity validations are taking longer than expected to process. This validation process is now taking 7-10 business days, and in some cases longer.

OJP strongly recommends starting your SAM.gov registration process as soon as possible to allow the time necessary to process entity validations well in advance of the Grants.gov due date posted in the solicitation. Read this FAQ for more information.

The Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Grant Application Resource Guide ("Guide") provides guidance to assist OJP grant applicants in preparing and submitting applications for OJP funding. It addresses a variety of policies, statutes, and regulations that apply to many (or in some cases, all) OJP program applicants, or to grants and cooperative agreements awarded in fiscal year (FY) 2023. Some OJP programs may have program solicitations that expressly modify a provision of this Guide; in such cases, the applicant is to follow the guidelines in the solicitation as to any such expressly modified provision.


