



Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department

- Understanding of RTCC and crime analysis best practices
- Guidance for creating a successful RTCC along with crime analysis
- Video, policies, technology

Developing an RTCC

- Personnel and staffing considerations (sworn versus civilian; integrate with crime analysis or not)
- Integrating other agencies/functions into a law enforcement RTCC (e.g., public transit)
- Operational hours: 24/7 or "on demand"
- Nature of chain of command and supervisory positions

RTCC Personnel Duties

- Background work and identifying and passing along useful information and evidence (including video) that can support active investigations/cases
- Help investigators navigate the video archives and databases for relevant information
- Prepare reports on the activities of the RTCC
- Learn about how new technology operates and evolves
- Exploring the ever-expanding range of data sources that are routinely available
- Other possible responsibilities might include:
 - Assisting with background investigations for new hires
 - Assisting with preparing warrants
 - Helping outside agencies with requests

Future of RTCC

- Body-worn cameras
- Facial recognition software
- Social media applications
- Integrating external public and private video feeds

Northern Ohio Violent Crime Consortium (NOVCC)

- Crime analysis capabilities assessment survey and process methodology
- Training plan for regional crime analysis
- Guidelines for data to be shared in regional effort
- Example of regional crime analysis products

Northern Ohio Violent Crime Consortium (NOVCC)

- NOVCC was established in October 2007 through a Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation Program grant
- Purpose: promote data-driven decisionmaking and use of evidence-based practices to prevent and/or reduce violent crime in participating law enforcement jurisdictions in the Northern District of Ohio

The NOVCC Operations

- A clearly defined purpose
- Partnership development and maintenance
- Organizational assessments and change plans
- Training and technical assistance
- Data collection and analysis
- Demonstration projects using evidence-based practices
- Information sharing and evaluation

Crime Analysis Readiness Assessment

- Assessed crime analysis capacity of individual agencies
- Structured interview protocol
- One-hour interview or online
- Covers:
 - Administrative and organizational support for crime analysis
 - Data accuracy, completeness, use, format
 - Resources for staff, software, IT/IS capacity, funding

Training Plan for Regional Crime Analysis

- Regional crime analysis program requires an ongoing training program for analysts, command staff, and line officers
- Cost-effective to conduct regionally and enhances the sharing of information and best practices
- Continuous training is necessary to keep members connected to regional issues and goals

Training Plan for Regional Crime Analysis

- Step One Regional Coordination of Training
- Step Two Stratify Training by Audience
- Step Three Yearly Training Assessment
- **Step Four** Implement Training Plan
 - The "Boot Camp" Model of Training



- Guideline documents, products, databases, and example policies make up the tools


