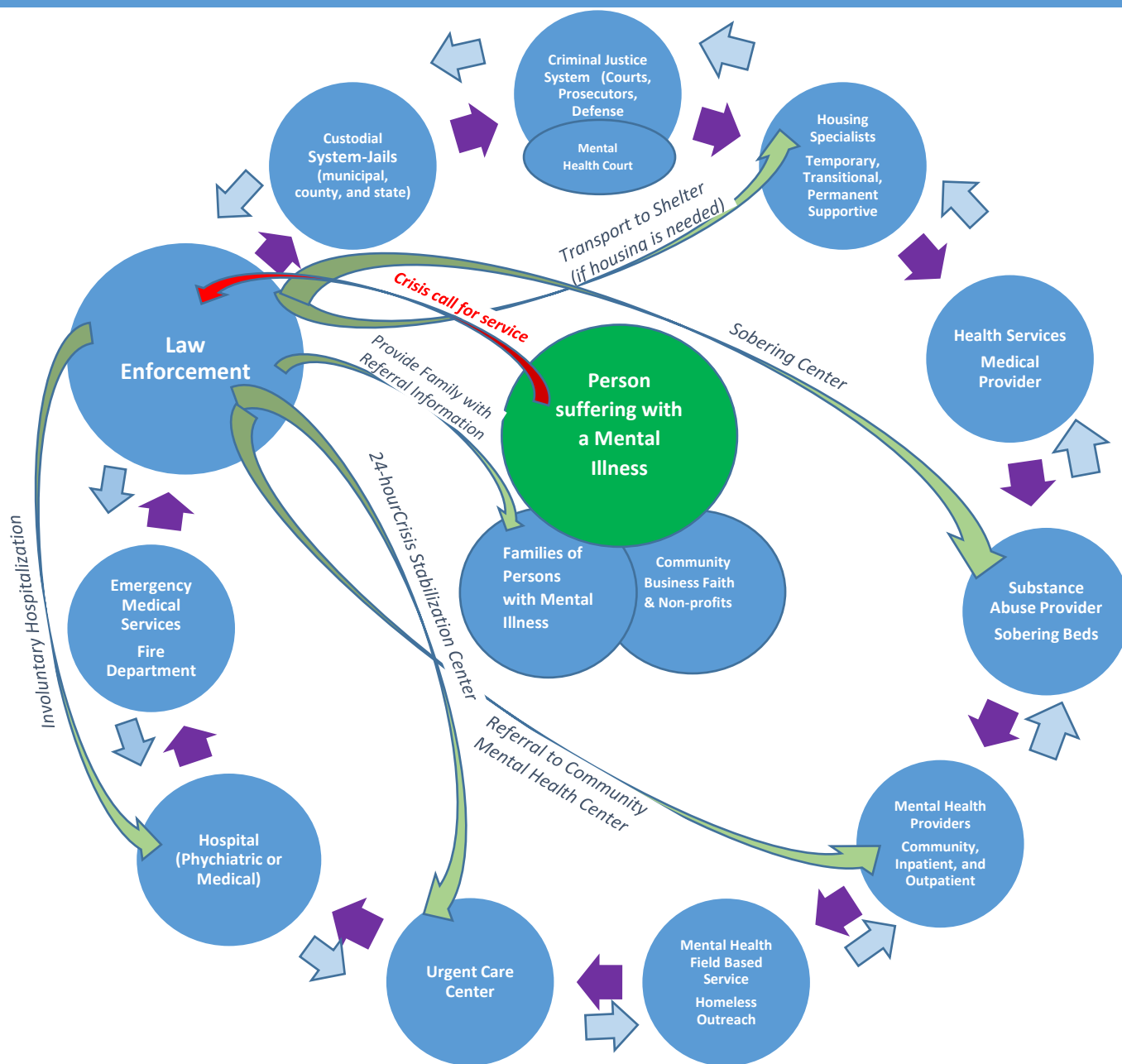


LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVERSION OF PERSONS WITH A MENTAL ILLNESS FROM THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM



Above is a graphic of the **systems** a *Person Suffering from a Mental Illness*, their families and the communities they live in must navigate in order to access services when a crisis has occurred. Law Enforcement as the **Gatekeeper** to mental health services has several options available to them to divert persons with a mental illness, who are in crisis from the criminal justice system. Officers have many options when dealing with the person suffering from a mental health crisis, the arrows above are just some of the options available to them.
