BJA's mission is to provide leadership and services in grant administration and criminal justice policy development to support local, state, and tribal justice strategies to achieve safer communities. Established in 2008, the **National Training and Technical Assistance Center (NTTAC)** promotes that mission by serving as a major source of justice-related training and technical assistance (TTA) information and resources to improve criminal justice systems nationwide. NTTAC works to improve the justice system by providing rapid, expert, coordinated, and data-driven training and technical assistance that support practitioners in state, local, and tribal communities in improving local justice system responses.

# Vision:

The vision of BJA NTTAC is to:

- Provide guidance to grantees and non-grantee criminal justice professionals to replicate model programs and approaches;
- Increase knowledge and use of best-practices, emerging technologies, and proven strategies, and;
- Assist agencies and jurisdictions in identifying and addressing operational and programmatic needs.

## **TTA Service Areas**

The TTA services provided through NTTAC cover a broad set of topic areas including training, information dissemination, technical assistance, and facilitation of multi-agency and cross-jurisdictional teams and working groups. The services offered include assistance implementing evidence-based programs, curriculum development, data analysis, onsite and distance learning training, peer-to-peer visits, research and information requests, and strategic planning assistance. These TTA services support the work of criminal justice practitioners and agencies, elected officials, and community organizations.
