Preparing for Field Deployment





- Location of BWV Camera Device
- Officers shall Ensure the Viewing Device is Paired with the Camera Prior to Field Deployment
- Inspection & Testing of BWV Equipment before each Deployment
 - Create a Test Video
- BWV Malfunctions or Damaged Equipment Procedures







All this data will now be added to your video and transferred to Evidence.com when you dock your BWV camera.

Additional BWV Rules & Duties

- Unauthorized Modifications to BWV Equipment
- BWV Restriction
 - Copy or attempt to Alter Captured Video
 - Content Property of the LAPD
- Documentation Required in your Reports
 - ▶ In your Narrative of the Report, add "This incident captured on BWV."
 - ▶ In the CAD System, Check the "DICV/BWV" Box
 - City Attorney Disclosure Form



Knowledge Check



Scenario A



Patrol officers are assigned to a two-office unit working uniformed patrol.

The officers are both equipped with BWV equipment, which has been inspected and in good working order. The officers receive a radio call of a 415 man at a business who is refusing to leave at 100 Central Ave.

The suspect is a M/H. 5'-6", 140 lbs, blue t-shirt and white pants. Officers respond and observe a possible suspect in the doorway the above location yelling at patrons inside the business.

When must the Officers start & stop the BWV Camera?



Choices

- A. Officers must START the recording while they go enroute to the radio call and STOP the recording after the investigative or enforcement activity involving a member of the public has ended.
- B. Officers must START recording once he/she arrives at the scene of the incident and STOP recording before the investigation or enforcement activity involving a member of the public has ended.
- C. Officers must START recording once he/she feels like it is appropriate and STOP recording before the investigation or enforcement activity involving a member of the public has ended.

Answer

A. Officers must START the recording while they go enroute to the radio call and STOP the recording after the investigative or enforcement activity involving a member of the public has ended.

Scenario B



Patrol officers are assigned to a two-office unit working uniformed patrol.

The officers are both equipped with BWV equipment, which has been inspected and in good working order.

The officers receive a radio call to respond to California Hospital for a possible Sexual Assault victim. See the PR - Nurse Nunez for additional information and directions to the victim.

Is this an appropriate use of the BWV camera?



Choices

- A. Yes, Officers shall record at all hospitals.
- B. No, Officers are not required to record inpatient care areas of a hospital, rape treatment centers, or other healthcare facilities unless an enforcement action is taken in these areas. A BWV recording recording could be inappropriate, due to the victim or witness's physical condition, emotional state, age, or sensitive circumstances (e.g., a victim of rape, incest or other forms of sexual assault).


Answer

B. No, Officers are not required to record inpatient care areas of a hospital, rape treatment centers, or other healthcare facilities unless an enforcement action is taken in these areas.  Select the Axon Icon which will launch the Evidence.com webpage






Logging On

Closing Key Points

- Assist in resolving complaints against officers, including false allegations by members of the public
