The Global Reference Architecture (GRA) is a framework and set of standards that justice and public safety practitioners can use to make it easier and faster to design information sharing solutions that align with best practices and national standards. GRA uses a service-oriented approach that—

- offers agencies system flexibility and allows them to retain system autonomy
- incorporates justice standards (NIEM, GFIPM)
- increases sharing and reuse of capabilities across agencies and jurisdictions, eliminating redundancy and improving resource use

The GRA provides specifications and guidelines so information sharing partners can identify, define, implement, and govern services across the jurisdiction.

To help stakeholders better understand the GRA framework, standards, methods, and processes, SEARCH and NCSC created the GRA Training. **This free, online course provides interactive, scenario-based training that allows you to put knowledge into action**—whether you're an executive, senior manager, project manager/coordinator, or implementer.
